

# **Community Funding Reports for the Community Development Block Grant Program**

## **Introduction**

NAHRO's community funding reports for the CDBG program provide estimates of Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 formula grant allocations for CDBG entitlement cities, urban counties, and state programs.

CDBG formula grant allocation data for FY 2004 and FY 2007 come from HUD's "Community Development Allocations and Appropriations," available online at <http://www.hud.gov/offices/cpd/communitydevelopment/budget/index.cfm>. Congress provided \$3.711 billion for formula grants for FY 2007 and \$4.331 billion for FY 2004.

NAHRO's FY 2008 CDBG formula grant allocation projections assume adoption of the President's proposed funding level for CDBG formula grants as presented in the Administration's FY 2008 budget. Although the budget proposes \$2.975 billion for operating the CDBG program, budget documents distributed by HUD have made clear the administration's intent to propose that \$200 million of the \$2.975 billion be set aside for a competitive "Challenge Grant Fund," meaning that the Administration's preferred FY 2008 funding level for CDBG formula allocations is \$2.775 billion. NAHRO's estimates do not assume changes to the CDBG formula structure.

NAHRO believes at least \$4.5 billion in CDBG formula grants for FY 2008 is needed to empower states, counties, and cities to begin to meet their housing and community development challenges and ensure quality American communities for the future.
