## **Regional Conferences**

Mountain Plains NAHRO partnered with Montana NAHRO and the Montana Housing Partnership for its 2019 conference which June 17-19 in Billings, Montana. The conference was attended by around 275 people with Adrianne Todman, Carl Richie and Sunny Shaw attending on behalf of National NAHRO. One of the highlights was a 2.5-hour Leadership Summit facilitated by Betsey Martens that was attended and well received by 45 people. Results for the election of officers for the 2019-2021 term were also announced.

### **Professional Development**

The Utah NAHRO, Colorado NAHRO and Mountain Plains NAHRO spring conferences all featured strong professional development tracks including leadership training, customer service, vicarious trauma, workforce wellness, aging in place, continuous quality improvement, responses to conflict and more.

### **Membership Growth and Retention**

Mountain Plains NAHRO's work efforts for the next three to five years will revolve around creating an invigorated <u>advocacy program</u>; rethinking <u>the annual conference</u>; and focusing on <u>peer to peer network connections</u>.
